SEE: I see you. I saw you at the mall yesterday. I have seen you here before. I will see you tomorrow at Mother's house. I should see Joe tomorrow. I am seeing a dentist tomorrow. Haven't you seen that movie before?

A: Will you see Joe anytime soon?

B: I should see him at Mother's party tomorrow.

A: Would you give him this gift? I thought I would see him before Christmas. But I missed him.

B: I'll give it to him the minute I see him.

A: Good. You will get to see him open it. I want you to see what I got him.

WATCH: I watch TV on New Year's day. We watched my favorite show. I enjoy watching television. Watching TV is a bad habit. Have you watched this movie?

C: Do you see what I see?

D: Do you mean the policeman hiding behind the sign.

C: Yes. He is watching for speeders.

D: I am not speeding, so I don't have to worry.

C: You should watch your speed as you enter town. The speed limit decreases very fast.

D: I see what you mean. The speed limit just went from 70 to 55.
