III. Describe what you see in each picture.

IV. Verbs:

dispose: throw away

I dispose of my trash after lunch. She disposes of her trash every day.

We disposed of the old tires.

They will dispose of our car.

He disposed of all the dirty rags.

The noun form of this word is “disposal”. Do you have a garbage disposal under your sink?

require: to have a need for something

- 1.Please help me. My brother requires medical care.
- 2.The bank required a driver’s license to cash a check.
- 3.The law requires you to wear a seat belt.
- 4.The sheriff is requiring all new driver’s to take a test.
- 5.My father was required to buy his uniform.

The noun form of this word is “requirement”. What are the requirements for becoming a citizen?

V. Present Continuous Verb Tense is (am/is/are) + (ing form of verb). It means something is happening now.

1.*Examples:*

I am working.

2.He is doing his job.

3.She’s eating.

4.We are running.

5.They are listening.

6.It is raining.

When using this tense in a question, the word order changes.

7.Is he working?

8.Is it raining?

9.Are the children staying here?

Some verbs are never used in the present continuous. They are: *want, know, prefer, hate, need, believe*. We use the present tense instead of present continuous. You can use these words in the past continuous.

Example:

We don't say, "I am preferring these boots." We say, "I prefer these boots."

We don't say, "I am not liking the movie." We say, "I don't like the movie." But we could say, "I was liking the movie until the violence started."
