Moisture--tiny drops of water in the air or on something. After the rain stops, the air is still **moist**.
Something that is **moist** is a little bit wet. You can also say it is **damp**. **Moisten** means to put a small amount of water on something.

Examples: Use a damp cloth to wash your face. The clothes feel damp. Moisten your lips with your tongue. Moisten the rag and wipe the table. Wipe the table with a moist rag. Moisten your skin with hand lotion. Wipe the moisture off of the table. There is moisture on the ground in the morning.
