 Jane: Yes, I have one bag.
 Ticket Agent: There is a charge of \$25.00 for each checked bag. How would you like to pay that?
 Jane: I will pay with my credit card. Here it is.
 Ticket Agent: Here is your boarding pass. Flight 335 is on time. It will board from gate 2 at 10:20.
