Working with future tense

*We usually use contractions with personal pronouns. Ex: I'll come to your party. He'll help us lift it. You'll do well on the test. It'll be OK.

*Practice pronouncing these contractions:

I'll You'll She'll We'll They'll He'll It'll

*We often contract **will** with nouns in speaking, but never in writing.

Example: We say-"The children'll be home late tonight." But we write-"The children will be home late tonight."

*When you are talking about something that will happen in the future, you can use **will** or **be going to**.

The meaning is the same. Ex: The weatherman said it will be cloudy tomorrow. The weatherman said it is going to be cloudy tomorrow. Ex: The teacher will clean up the room. The teacher is going to clean up the room.
