Yesterday was Halloween. In America we celebrate Halloween on October 31st.

On Halloween, we make jack-o-lanterns. How can I make a jack-o-lantern?

1. Buy a pumpkin.
2. Cut a circle around the stem.
3. Pull off the top.
4. Scrape out the seeds.
5. Carve a face.
6. Put a candle inside.
7. Put the top back on the pumpkin.
8. Now you have a scary jack-o-lantern.

Verbs:

cut-make an opening EX: The man cut his finger. The man cut the rope in two pieces.

carve-cut something to make a design EX: The old man carved the wood into the shape of a horse.

scrape-pull a sharp tool across a surface to remove dirt or hair or other objects EX: I scraped the paint off the wood.

Adjectives:

scary-something that frightens or scares you. EX: The haunted house was scary. I'm scared of ghosts.

The verb form of this word is "scare". EX: The spider scared me.

Nouns:



pumpkin
stem
seeds

Pumpkins are orange. The flesh of the **pumpkin** is good to eat. We make pumpkin pies and pumpkin bread. The stem of the pumpkin is what connects it to the vine. It is green. Pumpkin **seeds** are dried and salted before eating. Do you eat pumpkins? How do you prepare them.

Children **trick or treat** in costumes. They go to houses. They ring doorbells. They yell "trick or treat". Adults give them candy.

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Pronunciation-

You can pronounce it like you are saying the letter A, as in say, way, stay, day

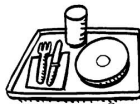


A lab is a place where scientists do experiments.
