Words to know: Study the definition and example then write a sentence with the word.

1- seek (verb)- to look for EX: You should seek medical attention if you have a very high fever. (The past tense of seek is sought.)


2-immune (adjective)- If you are immune to a disease, you cannot be affected by it. EX: I had chicken pox as a child. Now I am immune to chicken pox.

3-immunize (verb)-to give a drug which prevents your getting a disease EX: My son had a smallpox vaccination when he was small. He cannot get smallpox.

4-immunity (noun)- something that prevents you from getting a disease. EX: I have immunity to chicken pox because I had chicken pox as a child.

5-vaccine (noun)- a substance that contains the germs from a disease. If you get a vaccine it gives you a tiny dose of the disease. You do not get sick because it is such a small dose. Your body develops immunity to the disease.

6-vaccinate (verb)-given a vaccine EX: The children were vaccinated against polio before they started school.

7-syringe (noun)  EX: The doctor filled the syringe with antibiotic and injected the child.
