C. Idioms:

If you "let down" someone, you disappoint them. Examples: Joe let down his mother when he dropped out of school. I don't want to let down my teacher by failing the exam.

If you "get rid of something", you throw it away or give it away. Examples: I got rid of the children's old toys. Clean out the refrigerator and get rid of all the spoiled food.

If you "do without something", you manage without having it. Examples: I can't do without your help. It's too hard to do by myself. I have to do without new shoes because I don't have enough money to pay the rent.

If you "go against" someone, you don't do what they want. Examples: Joe went against his parents wishes and married Sara. I wouldn't go against my religious beliefs for any reason.

If someone is "in need" they need help. Examples: There are many homeless on the streets who are in need of a home. I am in need of a man to do yard work.
