

FUMC ESL 6-6-2013 Low Intermediate Lesson

Turn to page 144 of the OPD. Ask the students to read the vocabulary word for each picture. Ask them to describe everything they see in the picture. Have each student make a sentence. Try to get as many sentences about the picture as you can.

1-Look at picture 1. Who is lost? Where is the mother?

If you **lose** something, you can't find it. **Lost** is the past tense of lose.

I lost my son?	I will help you find him.
Are you lost?	Yes, I am lost. Where is the ESL classroom?
I lost my watch.	Your watch is here.
Did you lose your book?	No. This is my book.

2-Look at picture 2. The two cars hit. The red car hit the blue car. The woman and man are talking. This is a _____. Are the man and woman angry? Do you drive? Did you have a car accident? Tell about it.

3-The airplane crashed. It fell from the sky. It is on the ground. An ambulance is there. This is an _____. Are you afraid of an airplane crash?

Crash is a verb and a noun. Your car hits another car: it **crashes**. Cars crash. Bikes crash. Airplanes crash. People crash. I crashed my bicycle into the tree. There was a car crash on my street. The man crashed into me. Have you seen cars crash? Have you crashed your bike?

4-There is a train. The train is in the tunnel. The train carries coal. The coal exploded. There was a big explosion. An explosion is loud. This is called an _____.

If something explodes it blows up. Sometimes there is fire. The verb is **explode**, and the noun is **explosion**. Make a sentence with each word.

5-The earth shakes. There are cracks in the earth. The house is broken. This is an _____. Have you seen an earthquake on TV?

Shake is a verb. **Handshake** is a noun. EX: My hands **shake**. **Shake** my hand. He has a strong **handshake**. **Shook** is the past tense of shake. EX: He **shook** my hand.

In America, it is important for men to have a strong handshake. Is that true in your country?

6. The mud slides down the hill. The mud hit the house. The mud hit the trees. This is a _____ . Do you have mud slides in your country?

7. The trees are burning. The trees are on fire. The grass is burning. There are no houses here. This is a _____ . Have you seen a forest fire?

Burn is a verb and a noun. Touch something hot: you will **burn** your finger. You will have a **burn** on your finger. Name some things that burn. Talk about a time you burned yourself. Make a sentence with burn as a noun and a verb.

8. There is fire in the building. The building burns. The firefighter fights the fire. The fire truck is there. This is a _____ .

Fight is a noun and a verb. Two boys hit each other: they **fight**. The past tense of fight is **fought**. The boys fought about the girl. My parents shout at each other. They **fight**. They had a **fight** last night. Did you fight with your brothers or sisters? What did you fight about?
