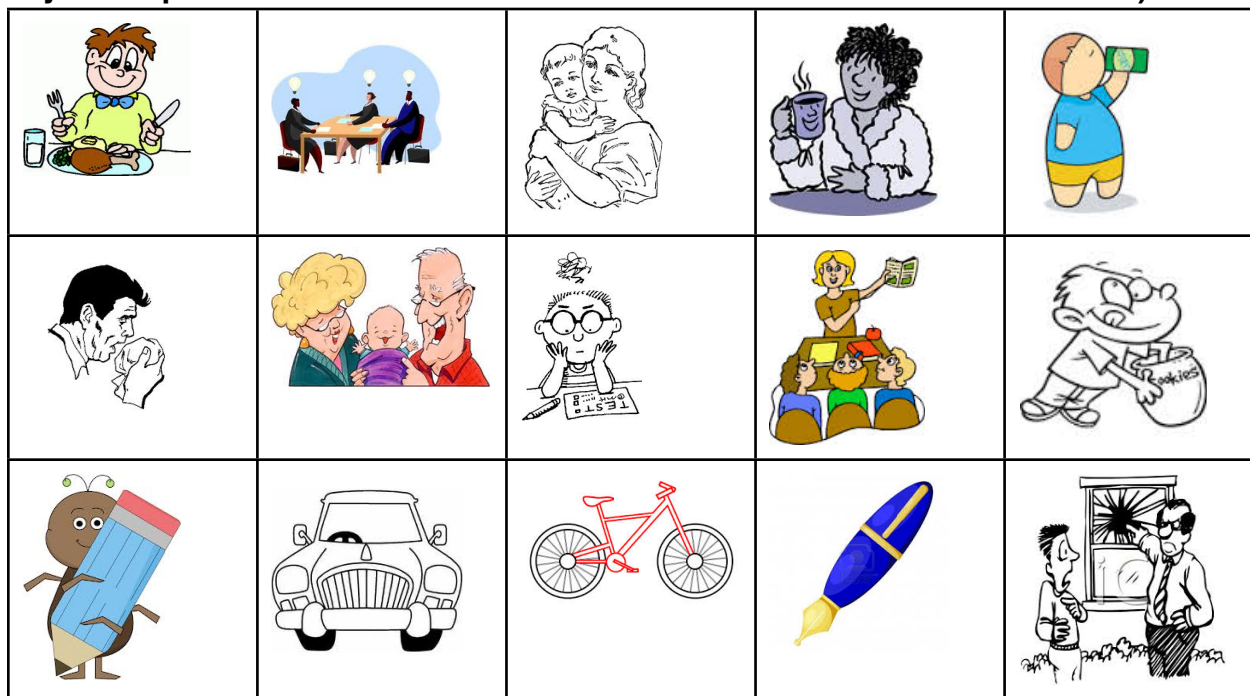

Past Tense of “have” is “had”:

I had a cold. You had a test He had some milk. We had lunch. They had a meeting.

VOCABULARY: Look at the vocabulary on page 150-151 of the OPD. This OPD lesson is about **transportation**. You **transport** people or things from one place to another. These are types of transport. Pronounce these words. Find the picture that matches the word.

We can put these vocabulary words together with “go” or “have” to make sentences.

Example: I go to school on the bus. I went to class on a bicycle. I went home in a taxi.

I have a bicycle I have a car. I had a truck.

We ride “in a car”, “in a taxi”, “in a truck” and “in a helicopter”. But we ride “on a train”, “on the subway”, “on a bicycle” or “on a bus”. We can go “in” or “on” an airplane.

A subway is at a **subway station**. A train is at the **train station**. A bus is at the **bus stop**. An airplane is at the **airport**.

We can put HAVE + TO GO together to make a sentence. Example: I have to go to the train station. I had to go to the airport. I have to go on my bicycle. I had to go on the bus.
