

## FUMC ESL Low Intermediate Lesson ---DO

### Present Tense:

I do. You do. He does. She does. We do. They do.

Things you can do:

				
do the dishes	do homework	do housework	do the laundry	do your hair

She does the dishes. The girl does homework. Mother does the housework. I do the laundry.  
My sister does my hair. I do many things on Saturday. I do grocery shopping on Saturday.

**Past tense of "do" is "did".** EX: She did the dishes. The girl did her homework. Mother did the housework. I did the laundry. My sister did my hair.

**The present tense of "do" is mainly used to answer questions. Read these examples.**

Who does the laundry? Mother does.  
Who does the best job? My daughter does.  
Who does the dishes? I do.

**Do can also be used to answer "make" questions. Read these examples.**

Who makes good grades? My son does.  
Who makes the best cookies? My grandmother does.  
Who made your purse? I did.  
Who made this mess? She did.

**The negative form of "do" is "don't". Read these examples.**

David doesn't have any money. I don't have a car. She doesn't have a job. We don't go to school. They don't work.

**When someone asks you, “What do you do?”, they are asking what your job is. Read these examples.**

What do you do? I am a student.

What did you do in China? I was a professor.

What does your wife do? She is an engineer.

What does your son do? He is a teacher.

What do YOU do? I am \_\_\_\_\_.

**When someone asks “What are you doing?” they mean what action are you taking right now. Read these examples.**

What are you doing? I am cooking dinner.

What is she doing? She is doing her homework.

What are they doing? They are watching TV.

What is he doing? He is doing the dishes.

We do not say: We are doing cooking. OR We are doing TV. We say, “We are cooking.” OR “We are watching TV.” See if you can correct these sentences.

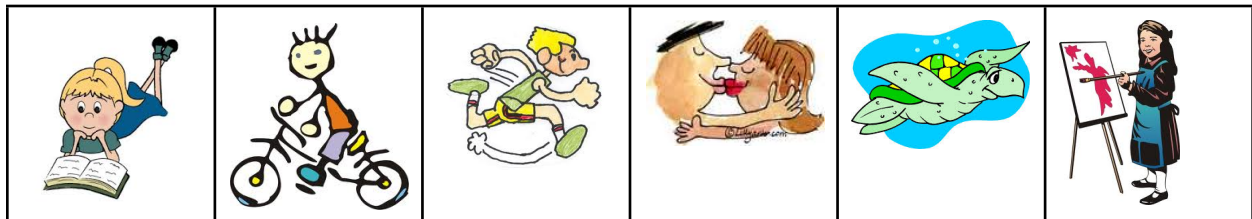
