CRAWL (move on hands and knees, move slowly, covered with moving things) The traffic crawls through the downtown streets at rush hour. After the explosion, the area was crawling with police. The dog was crawling with ticks after his run through the tall grass.

ROLL: (move, form into a ball or tube) The boy rolled the snowball down the hill. The ball rolls along the street to the bottom of the hill. Tanks rolled into the city. Tears rolled down her cheek. Roll up your trousers so they won't get wet. Roll up your sleeves and get to work.

Phrasal Verbs: A mother is a cook, driver and maid all rolled into one. Let's get the ball rolling on this project. The store agreed to roll back prices for one day. The company rolled out its new laptop hoping to attract new customers.

SKIP: (move by hopping from one foot to the other, jump, bounce along the surface, omit, not attend)

The girls skipped down the sidewalk. The children skipped rope on the playground. We skipped lunch because the meeting ran late. I skipped the last chapter of the book. The boys skipped the rocks along the surface of the pond.
