

## FUMC ESL 9-30-2013 High Intermediate Lesson

### Let's review the rules we learned last week for using **SOME** or **ANY**.

1. Use **SOME** in positive sentences. Use **ANY** in negative sentences.
2. Usually **ANY** is used in questions.
3. However, use **SOME** when offering something.
4. **SOME** is used when making a request.

### **MUCH** or **MANY**

**MUCH** modified only uncountable nouns. EX: They have so much money. The horse drank so much water.

**MANY** modified only countable nouns. EX: Many Americans travel to Europe. I collected many insects for my bug collection.

### **LITTLE** or **FEW**

**LITTLE** modifies only uncountable nouns. EX: There is little food in the house.

**FEW** modifies only countable nouns. EX: There are few doctors in this town.
