1/4 is one fourth or one quarter.

1/2 is one half

3/4 is three fourths or three quarters.



Read these sentences together: This is Joe. Joe measures Molly. Molly measures five feet six inches tall. Six inches is one half of one foot. Molly is five and a half feet tall. Her height is 5'6". What is your height?



Read these sentences together: This is Alan, Bob and Carl. They are tall. Bob is taller than Alan. Carl is taller than Bob. Carl is the tallest boy. Bob is shorter than Carl. Alan is the shortest boy. Write the name of the boys above their pictures.

Teacher: Draw a clock face on the board. Have the students say all the numbers on the clock face. Write one o'clock on the board. Draw the hour hand. Draw the minute hand. The hour hand is shorter than the minute hand. There are 60 minutes in one hour. Explain o'clock. O'clock means by the clock. Then have them say 1 o'clock, 2 o'clock, etc. all the way around the clock. Explain AM and PM. Look at the clocks on page 18. Talk about what time these clocks show. Show 1:15, 1:30, 1:45. Repeat with the other numbers, drawing the hands and asking them to say the time.
