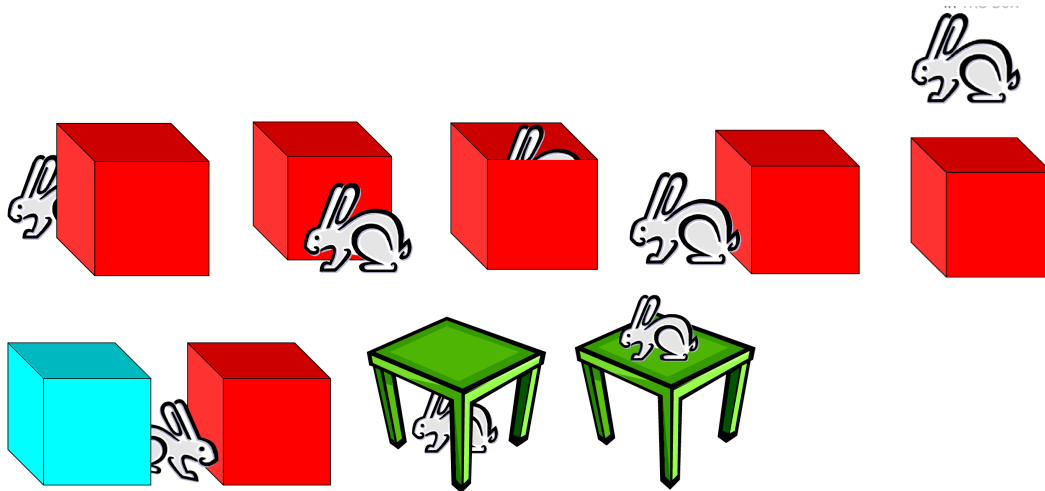

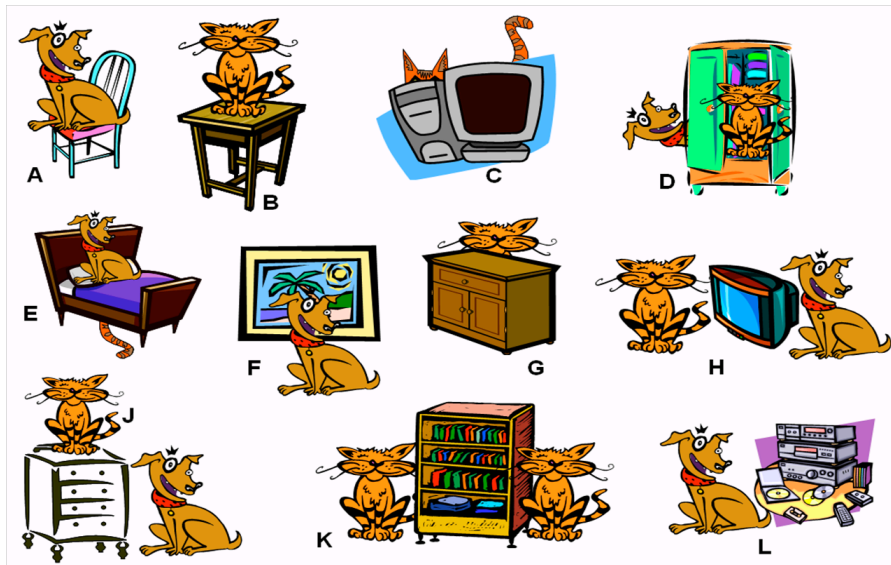

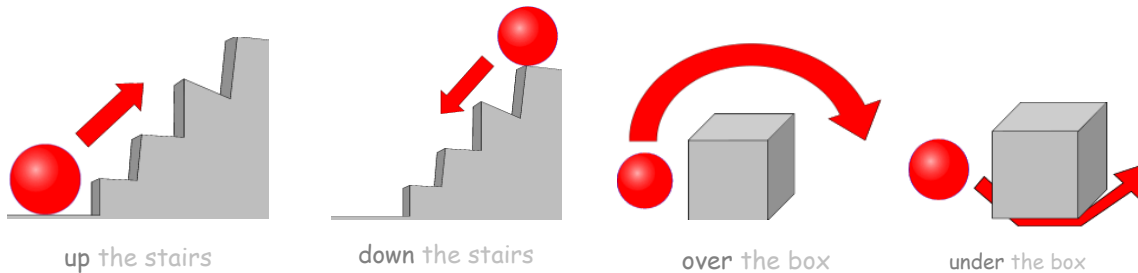

AT = a point

He waited at the bus stop.

She left her purse at her desk.

ON = a surface

She put it on the table.

She dropped her shoes on the floor.

IN = enclosed space

It is in my pocket.

They put it in a box.

There are exceptions. For example: You can stand at the corner or on the corner. The bus stops in Georgetown but at the Georgetown station. You get in a bus and in a car, but on a plane.
