Using WOULD

1. "Would you like" means "Do you want". EX: Would you like some coffee? Would you like to go dancing? Would you like to have dinner tonight?

2. "I would like" is the same as "I want". EX: I would like to stay home tonight. I'd like some tea, please. I'd like to go to dinner.

3. "Would you like" or "Do you like". Read these examples.

Would you like to go to the movies?

Do you like movies?

Would you like some orange juice?

Do you like orange juice?

What would you like to do next weekend?

What do you like to do on weekends?

6. We use "would" to talk about the past. EX: When I was a boy, we would make our soccer balls out of old rags. Every weekend my father would drive us into the countryside.

7. We use "would" to talk about the future in the past. EX: In London, she met the man she would one day marry. He left five minutes late unaware that the delay would save his life.

8. We use "would" in conditional clauses. EX: If I lost my job, I wouldn't have enough money to pay rent. If I were you, I'd refuse to help him. If you knew him, you would love him.

9. We use "would" to talk about things we want. EX: I wish you would stay. I thought John would help us. Do you think he would come if we asked him? I would love to live here.

10. We use "would" for polite requests. EX: Would you mind holding the door for me, please? What would be the best way to get downtown on a Saturday?

11. We use "would" to offer an opinion. EX: I would imagine he'll spend the night here. Some people would call him rude. I would have to agree with you. I would say nothing to your father about this.
