Verbs:

The verb that means to take a bath is **bathe**. Notice you add an E at the end of BATH. Read these sentences with bathe.

present tense: I bathe every morning.

past tense: I bathed last night.

future tense: I will bathe in the morning.

present continuous tense: I am bathing right now. (Notice you drop the E in the ING form of the verb.)

You can say "take a bath" instead of bathe. EX: I take a bath every morning. I took a bath last night. I will take a bath in the morning. I am taking a bath right now.

Hang is an irregular verb. The past tense of hang is **hung**. Read these sentences.

present tense: I hang the towels on the towel rack.

past tense: I hung the towels up.

future tense: I will hang the towels up.

present continuous: I am hanging the towels up.
