**Read these idioms and their definitions. Use them in a sentence.**

1. Something that is not allowed or permitted is “out of the question”.

Examples:

Daughter: Mother, may I stay out until 2 AM on prom night.

Mother: That is out of the question. You must be in by midnight.

Going home this year is out of the question. We can't afford it.

2. If you “pop the question”, you ask a woman to marry you.

EX: She waited for him to pop the question.

3. If something is, “beside the point”, it is not relevant or useful to the discussion.

EX: That's interesting, but beside the point.

Mother: You can't stay out past midnight.

Daughter: But Jim is a nice boy. You like him.

Mother: I do like Jim, but that is beside the point. Your father and I don't want you out after midnight, no matter who you are with.
