Finally, she picks up some chips and popcorn from the snacks aisle and heads for the check out stand. Unfortunately, there is a long line. She waits patiently until it is her turn. The cashier checks her out quickly and the sacker puts her groceries in the bags she has brought. On the way out, the manager asks if she needs help with all her groceries. She smiles and tells him, "No, thanks."

Marta loads the groceries into the car and drives home. She is happy to have completed her shopping.
