- a) A **penalty** is a punishment for doing something that is against the law or the rules.
- b) A **globe** is a ball-shaped map of the world. You can refer to the Earth as the globe. **Global** means concerning the whole world. We talk about **global warming** or global climate patterns.
- c) A **pocket** is a part of your clothing where you keep money or other things. **Pocket money** is a small amount of money that you keep in your pocket. Dads give their sons pocket money so they can buy meals and go on dates.
- d) You can use **stuff** to refer to things in a general way. EX: I keep lots of **stuff** in my purse. That's my **stuff** over there. If you **stuff** something, you fill it. You can **stuff** a turkey. The stuff inside is called **stuffing**. You can stuff some things in a bag. You can say, "This bag is **stuffed**." That means it has a lot of stuff in it.
- e) **Poison** is something that kills plants, animals or people. Some plants are **poisonous**. If you eat them, you get sick or die. If you eat bad food, you get **food poisoning**.
- f) A **rotisserie** cooks meat by turning it over the fire on a spit. The **spit** is the part that goes through the meat to hold it.
