VOCABULARY

1-Pronounce “grilled cheese sandwich”. A sandwich is two pieces of bread with something in the middle. Sometimes it is meat. Item 10 shows a sandwich with cheese in the middle.

2-Read this paragraph aloud. (Teacher-demonstrate as they read.)

How to Make a Grilled Cheese Sandwich

Get two pieces of bread. Butter one side of each piece. Put a slice of cheese in the middle. Put butter in a pan. Put the pan on the fire. Melt the butter. Put the sandwich in the pan. Cook until brown on bottom. Flip sandwich over. Cook until brown on bottom. Take out of pan. Eat.

3-Do you eat sandwiches? What kind of sandwich do you eat? “I eat sandwiches with _____.”

4-Some people eat bacon, lettuce and tomato sandwiches. They are called BLT (bacon, lettuce, tomato).

5-Some people eat peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. (PBJ)

6-Item 12 is a club sandwich. It has meat, cheese, lettuce, tomatoes. It is a big sandwich.

7-Item 13, 14, and 15 are salads. Salads are made with lettuce or spinach. You can put vegetables, eggs or meat in a salad.

8-Do you eat salad? What do you put in your salad? “I put _____ in my salad.

9-Item 16 is soup. This is chicken noodle soup. There are many kinds of soup. What kind of soup do you eat? What is a popular soup in your country?

10-Items 18, 19, 20 and 21 are also salads. Coleslaw is made from cabbage and carrots. (Look at OPD pg 69 to see cabbage and carrots)

11-Potato salad is made with potatoes, onions, eggs, mayonnaise or mustard. Pasta salad is made with pasta (noodles) and vegetables.

12-Which salad would you choose? coleslaw potato salad pasta salad fruit salad

13-Some people put dressing on their salad. There are many kinds of dressings.

14-Read these conversations with a partner. Read each conversation twice. Answer the questions together. (Teachers have them alternate characters so they get a chance to read both parts of the conversation. Explain “waiter” to them before you start.)

Rob: I need a menu.

Waiter: Here is a menu for you.

Rob: Thank you. I will have a grilled cheese sandwich and a salad, please.

Waiter: Do you want a spinach salad or a lettuce salad?

Rob: I will have a spinach salad. But I do not want bacon in my salad.

The "to be" verbs are is, am, are, was, were. We use is, am, are in the present tense. We use was, were in the past tense. The verb must agree with the subject.

We say, "I am happy." "You are happy." "He is happy." "We are happy." "They are happy." "I was happy." "You were happy." "He was happy." "We were happy." "They were happy."
