VERB TENSES

We have studied present perfect tense: have/has + past participle. The past perfect is almost the same, except you use had + past participle. EX: She had called the office to try to find Rick, but he had already left.

The **Past Perfect** expresses the idea that something occurred before another action in the past. It can also show that something happened before a specific time in the past.

Examples:

- 1. I had never seen such a beautiful beach before I went to Kauai.
- 2. I did not have any money because I had lost my wallet.
- 3. Tony knew Istanbul so well because he had visited the city several times.
- 4. Had Susan ever studied Thai before she moved to Thailand?
- 5. She only understood the movie because she had read the book.
- 6. I went to bed early that night because I had been feeling very tired for several days.

Have + been (part participle of be) + ing verb. We use this when something started in the past and continued up to now. EX: I have been studying English for two years. They have been driving for hours.
