WORKING

1-**What do you do?** This is how people ask what your job is. But you don't answer by saying, I do..... You usually answer by saying, **I am....**

What do you do? I'm an engineer. I'm a doctor. I'm a student. I'm a pharmacist.

2-Sometimes you answer, **I work in...**

You use this to describe the field of your work. EX: I work in instructional technology. I work in medical sales. I work in the aerospace industry.

3-People might ask, "**What do you do for a living.**" This means what is your job that you get paid for. You answer the same as you do for "What do you do?"

4-You can talk about how people make their living. EX: She makes a living painting houses. Jack makes his living by selling bottles to the re-cycling plant. (a plant is a place where things are manufactured OR a living organism that grows)

Form a group of 4 or 5. Take turns asking, "What do you do?". Ask the following questions to all members of the group.

1. Are you working now in a job that is not in your field because you have not found a job in your field?
2. Do you intend to work in the U.S.?
3. What is the best job you have ever had?
4. What is the longest you have been out of work?
5. Would you like to change fields? In other words, would you like to work in a different type of job?

MORE "WORK" VOCABULARY

1-The "workplace" is a general term for where people work. EX: Conditions in the workplace must be sanitary.

2-If you work "full-time", you work 8 hours a day at least 5 days a week. If you work "part-time", you work less hours and/or less days. If you work overtime, you are working beyond 40 hours a week. Professional positions (like salesmen, doctors, lawyers, clergy, teachers) usually do not pay overtime. Professionals work for a monthly salary. Most blue collar jobs do pay overtime because workers are paid an hourly wage.

3-Manual labor is physical work done by hand. If you do something by hand, you do it with your own hands. If something has been made by an individual, not in a factory, it is hand-made.

4-The work force is all of the people who are available to work. EX: The U.S. has a very large work force due to immigration.
