

FUMC ESL 3-2-2017 Advanced Lesson

Students take turns reading a sentence and explaining the meaning to your group. You can draw a diagram on the whiteboard if that helps you explain.

1. Exit the freeway and stay on the **access road** past MLK.
2. The mall entrance is on the **frontage road**.
3. The **entrance ramp** traffic must **merge** into the **thru lanes**.
4. The **two lane** road becomes a **four lane**.
5. There is a **median** separating you from the **oncoming traffic** on a **divided highway**.
6. Turn left at the first street after the **pavement** ends.
7. It's a **gravel** road.
8. **No right turn on red**.
9. The **freeway** becomes a **tollway** in another mile.
10. **Yield** to the traffic **exiting the freeway**.
11. The street will **curve** to the left.
12. Make a **U-turn** under the **overpass** and head east.
13. Our house is at the **end of the cul de sac**.
14. The street you are on **dead-ends** in two more **blocks**.
15. **Veer right** onto Hwy 2222.
16. Go straight through the **intersection**, then turn left at the first street.
17. The **first leg of the journey** should takes us about ten hours.
18. Stay in the **far right** lane because you will turn right in about a **quarter mile**.
19. The **detour** will send you two blocks south.
20. Don't park on the **shoulder** of the road.
21. The cars on the larger road have the **right of way**.
22. Go around the **traffic circle** and turn right on the third street.
23. Stop at the **pedestrian crossing (zebra crossing in UK)** if someone is waiting to cross.
24. My husband is such a **back seat driver** that I don't like to have him in the car.
25. She **double parked** because there weren't any spots in the lot.
26. They will check your **emissions** when your car is inspected.
27. Slow down, there is a **hairpin turn** up ahead.
28. I was stuck in **gridlock** at **rush hour**.
29. The engine **overheated** because we were **idling** so long in the bad traffic.
30. If you need to use the restroom, there is a **rest area** ahead.
31. Speeding in a **school zone** will double your **ticket**.
32. There were many **switchbacks** going up the mountain.
33. That **semi** is **tailgating**.
34. There was a **rollover** at the intersection. Someone **ran the red light** and **broadsided** a car.
35. They're going to need a **tow**.
36. The truck **skidded** off the slick pavement.

- 38.Slow down, there are **speed bumps** ahead.
- 39.**Shift into low** going down the steep hills to save **wear and tear** on your brakes.
- 40.He **swerved** into my lane to avoid the other car.
