- Do you have a driver's license?
 Do you hope to get a driver's license?
 Did you have a driver's license in your country?

Look at the vocabulary on pages 136-137. It is against the law to drive without a driver's license. There are driving schools that will teach you how to drive. Or you can take the driving test at a DPS (Department of Public Safety) office. To apply for a driver's license you must have:

- 1- proof of identity (your passport), proof of Texas residency, social security number (If you are not eligible for a Social Security # you must fill out a form saying you are not eligible.)
- 2- an application filled out (available at the DPS office)
- 3- If you are an alien, you must present proof of "lawful presence" to get a driver's license. This is your visa and or immigration papers.

You must apply in person. You must pay all fees. You must pass a knowledge test and a driving test.

A handbook is a small book that will fit in your hand. It is "handy" or "convenient".

Let's look at some of the verbs on these pages.

Prove: You have to prove your identity. You prove it by having proof. Proof is a noun. Proof is like evidence, it proves something.

Expire: come to an end. If your driver's license expires, it isn't good any more. If your VISA expires, you have to return to your home country. The date something expires is the expiration date. Most food has an expiration date on it. After that date, it may not be good to eat. Medicine has an expiration date as well. Do you ever take medicine that has expired?

Register: enter or record in an official list. You register to become a citizen. You register to get a driver's license. You register to get a library card. This usually means filling out a form and giving it to an official. Your registration is the form on which you registered. Your car has a registration sticker to prove you registered the car. Your registration sticker has an expiration date on it. Have you ever forgotten to register your car before the sticker expired? Did you get a ticket?
