Conditional Words:

We use “if” to talk about what would happen in certain conditions. EX: If I had a dog, I would take it to the park every day. If it rains on Saturday, we won’t go to the concert. If Dad calls, tell him I’ll be there in an hour.

In addition to “if” there are several other words and phrases for expressing condition.

EXAMPLES: You can’t get in **unless** you have a ticket.

You can use my bike **on condition** that you return it by tomorrow.

In case of fire, don’t use the elevator.

You can stay **as long as** you don’t mind sleeping on the sofa.

You can use my washing machine **provided that** you don’t use it after 9 PM.

We talk about possibility using **suppose** or **what if**.

Suppose it rains tonight - will the baseball game be cancelled?

What if she forgets to pick me up? Should I catch a bus?

Conditions with **ever**

However you do it, it will cost a lot of money.

You’ll get to the train station, **whichever** bus you take.

Whoever wins the election, nothing will really change.

That box is so big, it will be in the way **wherever** you leave it.
