There are several words, besides IF, that can be used to show condition. These are **HOWEVER**, **WHICHEVER**, **WHOEVER**, **WHEREVER**, **WHATEVER**.

Examples:

However you decide to repair it, it will cost a lot of money.

You'll get to the airport, **whichever** bus you take. They all go to the airport.

Whoever wins the game will be awarded the trophy.

That box is so big, it is in the way **wherever** you put it.

Whatever you decide to do, it will be fine with us.
