Say: moist, moisture, moisten, moisturize

**Moisture**--tiny drops of water in the air or on something. After the rain stops, the air is still **moist**. Something that is **moist** is a little bit wet. You can also say it is **damp**. **Moisten** means to put a small amount of water on something. **Moisturize** means to put lotion on your skin.

**Examples:**

Moisten your lips with your tongue.  
Moisturize your hands with lotion.
