

## FUMC ESL 4-21-2022 High Beginning and Low Intermediate Lesson

Introduce yourself. Tell where you are from and where you live now.

**PRONUNCIATION:** EE words are usually pronounced with the long E sound. Say these words: meet, feet, sweet, street, greet, sheet, teeth, sleep, keep.

Usually EA words are pronounced with the long E sound. Say these words:

tea	read	speak	pea	sea	bead	flea
beak	leak	weak	cheap	clean	peach	east

BUT there are exceptions. Pronounce these words: steak, break, great.

These words have the long A sound like bake. The word "learn" has a short U sound. "Bread, dead, health" have the short E sound.

The verb, breathe is pronounced with the long E sound. But the noun, breath, is pronounced with the short E sound. Heal is a verb pronounced with the long E sound, but the noun, health, is pronounced with the short E.

### LIFE GOES ON LESSON 3-A DELAYED FLIGHT

Jonas is at the airport in Los Angeles. He is very tired after a fifteen-hour flight from Hong Kong. But Jonas isn't home yet. He still needs to fly home to Atlanta.

Jonas walks toward the gate. He walks quickly because his flight leaves in thirty minutes. At the gate, Jonas looks up at the monitor. His flight, 631, is delayed by an hour. Jonas is disappointed. He really wants to get home. But Jonas is hungry. He goes to an airport restaurant and eats a sandwich. He goes to an airport store and buys a book. Then he returns to his gate.

At the gate, Jonas hears an announcement. His flight is delayed again. This time it's delayed by 45 minutes. Jonas is very frustrated, but what can he do? Jonas sits down and opens his book. He reads a few pages, but his eyes feel very heavy. Slowly Jonas' closes his eyes and falls asleep.

Suddenly, Jonas wakes up and looks around. He looks up at the monitor. Jonas missed his flight! Jonas is very angry at himself.

An airline worker tells Jonas he needs to buy a new ticket to Atlanta. She says, "Don't worry. There's another flight to Atlanta in about an hour. But the flight is delayed by an hour."

Jonas slides down into a chair. What a day he has had.

The **reflexive pronouns** are myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, themselves.

We use reflexive pronouns when the subject and object are the same person. EX: Paul was angry at himself. Paul and himself are the same person.

Ourselves, yourselves and themselves are plural. EX: They were proud of themselves. You should be ashamed of yourselves.
