More Irregular Verb Patterns

Irregular verbs are verbs that don't make the past tense by adding ED. In prior lessons we talked about patterns for irregular verbs. Today we will look at a new pattern. In this pattern, the past tense changes to a long O sound and the past participle ends in EN. We use the past participle form of the verb in present perfect tense (have or has + past participle).

Read these examples.

choose - chose - chosen	freeze - froze - frozen	rise - rose - risen
steal - stole - stolen	speak - spoke - spoken	break - broke - broken
drive - drove - driven	ride - rode - ridden	write - wrote - written
