### Grammar: Using ANY and SOME

#### Use SOME in positive sentences:

I'm going to buy **some** clothes.

There's **some** ice in the freezer.

We made **some** mistakes.

#### Use ANY in negative sentences:

I'm not going to buy **any** shoes.

There isn't **any** ice in the freezer.

We didn't make **any** mistakes.

#### in MOST questions (but not all), we use ANY (not SOME):

Is there **any** ice in the freezer?

Have you got **any** money?

Do you need **any** help?

#### We usually use SOME (not ANY) when we offer things:

Would you like **some** coffee?

Can I get you **some** soup?

Help yourself to **some** cake.

#### OR when we ask for things:

May I have **some** soup, please?

Can you lend me **some** money?

Would you take **some** pictures of me and my wife?

#### We can use SOME or ANY without a noun following :

Did you take any photographs? No, but Jane took **some**.

You can have some coffee, but I don't want **any**.

I've just made a cake. Would you like **some**?

Do you have any sugar? Yes, I believe we have **some**.

I forgot to bring shampoo. Do you have **any** I can borrow?

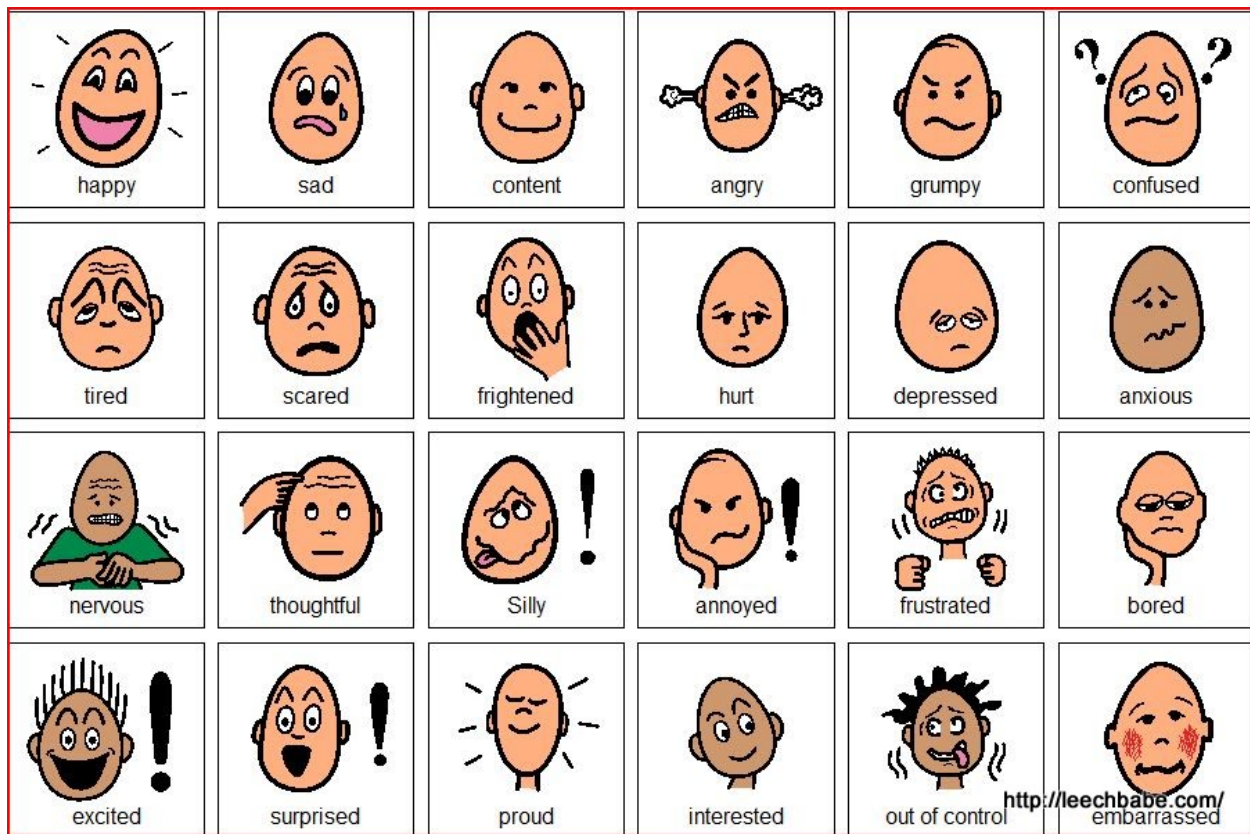
I have lots of extra paper if you need it. Thanks, I don't need **any**.
