

FUMC ESL 2-27-2023 High Beginning and Low Intermediate Lesson

**Introduce yourself.** Tell where you are from and where you live now. Finish this sentence: I have no \_\_\_\_\_ in my refrigerator.

**Last Thursday we talked about SOME and ANY. We use SOME with positive sentences and ANY with negative sentences and with questions. Let's continue that discussion.**

1-Use NO plus a noun. EX: I have no money. There is no excuse for his behavior. There is no reason you can't go. (Teachers discuss the difference in reason and excuse.)

2-Use NONE without the noun. EX: Do you have any money. No, I have none. Were there any problems? No, none. How many of the children failed the exam? None. You can also use NONE followed by a prepositional phrase. EX: None of the children failed. NOT: None children failed. None of us have been here before. NOT: No of us have been here before.

3-NO ONE is the same as NOBODY: Use it to answer the question "Who". EX: Who rode the bus home? No one. Who helped you move? Nobody.

4-We use Anybody with NOT. EX: There is not anybody living here. Same as-There is nobody living here. I don't know anyone in my class. Same as-I know no one in my class.

5-You can use NOT ANYTHING or NOTHING to answer a question. EX: What did you say? Nothing. I didn't say anything. What happened? Nothing happened. What did your teacher say? She didn't say anything.

6-We say, "He doesn't know anything." NOT. "He doesn't know nothing." You can't use two negatives together.

We say, "Don't tell anybody (anyone)." NOT: "Don't tell nobody (no one)."

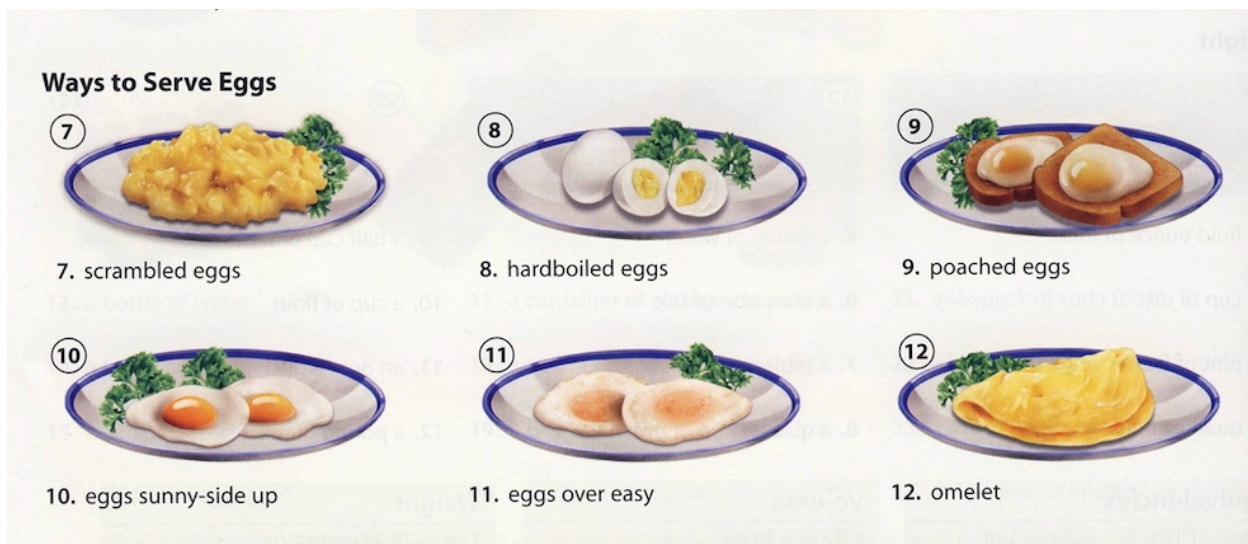

Read the paragraph and discuss.
