Suddenly, Jonas wakes up and looks around. He looks up at the monitor. Jonas has missed his flight! He is very angry at himself.

An airline worker tells Jonas he needs to buy a new ticket to Atlanta. "But don't worry," she says. "There's another flight to Atlanta in about an hour."

"Oh, good," says Jonas.

"Well," she says, "maybe two hours. That flight is delayed an hour."
