Pronouncing Past Tense Verbs:

Regular past tense verbs end in ED. But verbs ending in ED are not always pronounced the same. There are 3 ways ED endings can be pronounced.

1-Final ed is pronounced "T" after the following ending sounds: k,p,s,ch,sh,f.

Examples: looked, clapped, missed, watched, finished, laughed

2-Final ed is pronounced "D" after the following sounds: l,v,n,b and all vowel sounds

Examples: smelled, saved, cleaned, robbed, played

3-Final ed is pronounced as ED after t and d sounds. The sound ed adds a whole syllable to a word.

Examples: decided, needed, wanted, invited

Using EVEN

Even can be an adverb. We use it to talk about something surprising or unusual. Read and explain these sentences.

1. He was very poor. He didn't **even** have money for a hamburger.
2. I was strong before. But now I am **even** stronger.

4. My mother always wears a sweater, **even** in summer.

You can use *even though*, *even when* and *even if* with a subject + verb.

Even though she can't drive, she bought a car.
I can't reach the top shelf, **even if** I stand on my tiptoes.
He never shouts, **even when** he is angry.

Even can be an adjective. It has different meanings as an adjective. It can mean flat, level or smooth. EX: You need a flat, **even** surface to build a tennis court.

It can also mean sort by equal amounts. EX: Be sure the portion sizes are **even**. I don't want one child to get more than another.

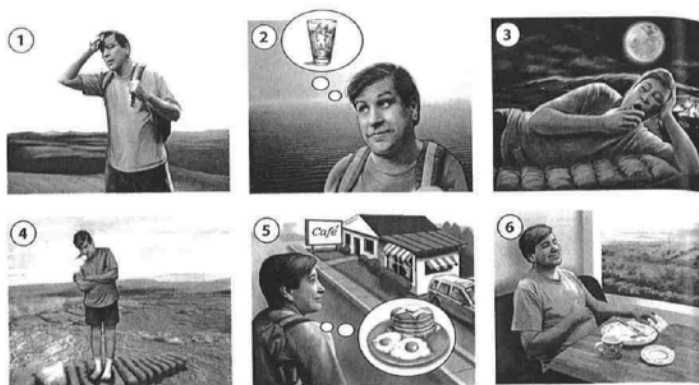
EX: I paid for your lunch last time. If you pay for mine today, we will be **even**.

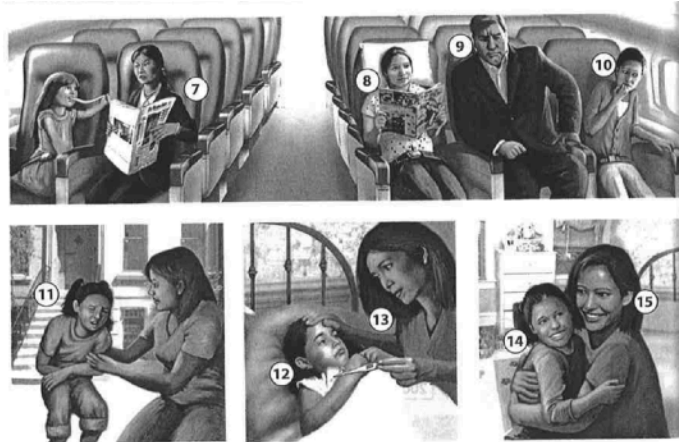
