**Customer:** I like the **one** with the big brim. I'll buy that one.

Can you lend me a pen?

I'm sorry, but I don't have **one**.

ONES is **plural**

Husband: I'd like to buy some roses for my wife.

Saleswoman: We have white roses and red roses. Which ones do you like?

Husband: I like the red ones.

Which books are yours?

The ones on the table.

I found these keys. Are these the ones you lost?

Yes, those are the ones.

I don't like the red shoes, but I like the blue ones.

These cups are dirty. Can we have some clean ones?

### **FRIENDS**

**PHRASAL VERBS:** A phrasal verb is a verb followed by an adverb. Phrasal verbs can be very confusing. For example, we have "burn up" and "burn down". Which should we use?

For example, All my clothes burned up when my house burned down. Why do we use burn up and burn down.

"Burn up" refers to something burning and completely consuming all of its fuel, typically resulting in the destruction of the object. For example, a rocket "burns up" upon reentry into the Earth's atmosphere. "Burn down" refers to a structure that is burned. EX: The house burned down. The office building burned down.

We also use "burn down" when we are talking about a fire that gets smaller as the wood is burned. EX: Let the fire burn down, then shovel some dirt over the ashes to make sure it doesn't start a forest fire.

When a house "burns to the ground", there is very little left of the house.

### **Idioms with BURN**

Were your **ears burning**, Tim? We were talking about you.

I tried to fry fish last night, but I **burned them to a crisp**.

Priscilla **burned her bridges** when she said she was quitting and insulted the manager. She won't ever work here again.

I was very polite when I told the manager I was leaving for another job. I didn't want to **burn my bridges**.

Money always **burns a hole in my pocket**. If I have cash, I will probably spend it by the end of the day.

Many teachers got **burn out** during Covid. Many got so **burned out**, they left teaching and got other jobs.

Pat **burned through** all the money he inherited from his father. Now he will have to get a job.

No wonder poor Maria is sick. She is **burning her candles at both ends**. She is working from home while trying to monitor her children's online schooling. Then at night, when they are asleep, she participates in Zoom classes at the community college. I don't know when she sleeps.

I got out some frozen fruit this morning for a smoothie, but it had **freezer burn**. I couldn't use it.

### **Discuss:**

1-Tell about a time when you were cooking and burned some of the food. Does this often happen to you?

2-Have you ever burned yourself badly by accident? Tell about it.

3-What can you do if you want to leave your job at a company but you don't want to burn your bridges?

4-Does money burn a hole in your pocket. If someone gives you a hundred dollar bill, would you run out and spend it, or put it in the bank for a future purchase?

5-What careers have a high burn out rate? Have you ever felt burned out in your job or your life?

6-Do you know anyone who inherited money and burned through it quickly?

7-Do you feel you are burning your candle at both ends? Explain.

8-We use "burning up" to talk about how hot we are. The temperature outside is over 100 degrees. I am "burning up". Do you tolerate extreme heat or extreme cold better?

9- Read this poem called The Old Fireplace. Explain the meaning.

How sad is the memory of days that are gone  
When parents and children in a circle at home  
Around the Old Fire-place would cheerfully gather,  
Away from the cold and inclemency of weather.

Do you like to sit around a fire? Do you have a fireplace in your home? What is the magic of a fire? What kinds of things can you do around a fire?

Teachers: If you finish this lesson early, have the students take turns asking each other questions.
