Vocabulary: Talking About Work

1-**What do you do?** This is how people ask what your job is. But you don't answer by saying, I do.....

You usually answer by saying, **I am....** What do you do? I'm an engineer.

I'm a doctor. I'm a student. I'm a

pharmacist.

2-Or you answer, I work in...

You use this to describe the field of your work. EX: I work in instructional technology. I work in medical sales. I work in the aerospace industry. You can also use "work in" for a place. EX: I work in an office. I work in a meat market. I work in Paris. Or, the department you work in: EX: I work in the human resources department.

3-People might ask, **"What do you do for a living."** This means what is your job that you get paid for. You answer the same as you do for "What do you do?"

4-You can talk about how people **make their living**. EX: She makes a living painting houses. Jack makes his living by selling used cars.

5-The "**workplace**" is a general term for where people work. EX: Conditions in the workplace must be sanitary. Have you ever spent time in a bad workplace? What kind of workplace would you NOT be able to tolerate?

6-If you work "<u>full-time</u>", you work 8 hours a **day** at least 5 days a week. In the U.S., a fulltime job means at least 40 hours per week. If you work "<u>part-time</u>", you work less hours and/or less days. If you work <u>overtime</u>, you are working more than 40 hours a week. <u>Professional</u> positions (like salesmen, doctors, lawyers, clergy, teachers) usually do not pay overtime. Professionals work for a monthly <u>salary</u>. Most <u>blue collar</u> jobs do pay overtime because workers are paid an <u>hourly wage</u>.

Which is better, to be an hourly worker and get paid overtime, or to be a salaried worker?

7-<u>Manual labor</u> is physical work done by hand. If you do something **by hand**, you do it with your own hands. If something has been made by an individual, not in a factory, it is <u>hand-</u><u>made</u>. Have you ever received a hand-made gift you really loved?

8-If you are **unemployed**, you don't have a job right now. You can also say, "I'm out of work." If you are **between jobs**, you don't have a job right now, but you are looking for a job. If you work for yourself, you are **self-employed**. EX: I am self-employed. I own a coffee shop.

9. If you do a good job, you might get a **promotion** or a **pay raise**. If you do a bad job, you might get **fired**. If your company is not making enough money, you might get **laid off**.

10. The **work force** includes all of the people who are available to work. EX: The U.S. has a very large work force, so we are able to manufacture machines very quickly.
