Introduce yourself. Tell where you are from and where you live now. Tell something about yourself.

Pronunciation of the TH sound

Many languages do not have the sound that English speakers make when they say TH.

Say these phrases:

Thank you. Think of me. Take a bath. Close your mouth. Tell the truth.

When you say the TH sound, your tongue is touching your top teeth. When you say words that begin with T, your tongue is on the top of your mouth behind your teeth. Say these word pairs and notice where your tongue is.

thank - tank	thin - tin	thought - taught	bath - bat	thigh - tie
path - pat	Beth - bet	Bert - birth	thick - tick	fort - fourth

Practice pronouncing these TH words.

TH at the beginning	TH in the middle	TH at the end
they	wealthy	bath
thank	birthday	month
thought	something	both
thirsty	toothpaste	south

Using Phrasal Verbs: Phrasal verbs are verbs followed by a preposition or an adverb.

GET OFF or **GET OUT OF**

We get off a bus, a plane, a boat, a subway, a chair, a ladder.

We get out of a car, a taxi, a truck

LOOK FOR

I am looking for my car keys. I am looking for a silk blouse that I can wear with my new skirt.

What is something you are looking for?

LOOK FORWARD TO

I am looking forward to going to the lake this weekend.

What are you looking forward to?

LOOK IN ON

I'll look in on grandmother on my way home. Mother looks in on the children every few minutes to make sure they are safe.

LOOK ON

The crowd looked on as the firemen tried to put out the fire.

LOOK ON (2nd definition)

Sara and I are not related but we are very close. In fact, I look on Sara as part of my family.

Do you have a close friend who you look on as family?

LOOK OUT FOR

Deb looked out for her little sister when they were in school. Deb never let the other kids tease her sister.

Who did you look out for? OR Who looked after you when you were young?

LOOK UP (someone)

When I was in San Diego, I looked up my old next door neighbor. It turns out she still lives in the same house.

Have you ever looked up someone who you haven't seen in many years?

LOOK UP TO

I look up to my father. He didn't have much education, but he made himself successful.

Who do you look up to?
