

## FUMC ESL Halloween Lesson for Beginning Classes



This is a witch. She wears a tall hat. She rides on a **broomstick**.



This witch stirs a pot. The pot is called a cauldron. Inside is the witch's brew.



This is a ghost. A ghost is a spirit.



This is a skeleton. Skeletons have bones.



This is a pumpkin. It is orange. It has a stem.



This is a jack-o-lantern. It is a pumpkin with a face. Someone carved this pumpkin. Carve means to cut.



This is a cemetery. We bury people here. (bury-dig a hole and put something in) A graveyard is the same as a cemetery. There are many graves in a grave yard.



This is a black cat. Witches have black cats. Black cats are unlucky. If you have good luck, good things happen. If you have bad luck, you are unlucky.



This is a bat. They fly at night. Are bats scary?



This is a devil. Devils are evil. Angels are good. Devils and angels are opposite.



This boy is scared. What is he scared of? What scares you.

**Read these Halloween stories:**

Today is October 31st. October 31st is Halloween. We buy pumpkins. We carve pumpkins. We put a candle in the pumpkin. We call this a jack-o-lantern. We put it at the front door. At night, we light the candle. The jack-o-lantern glows.

Children wear costumes. They dress like witches, devils, ghosts or skeletons. They walk to houses. They ring doorbells. They say, "trick or treat". The children won't trick you. They want candy. Give them candy!

After Halloween, children eat candy. Children love candy. Sometimes, parents take candy away.
